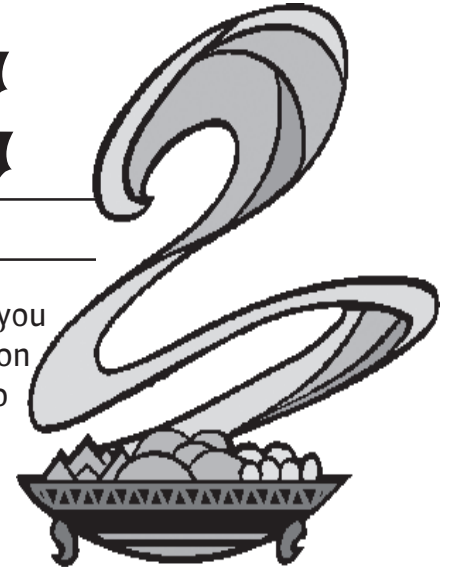

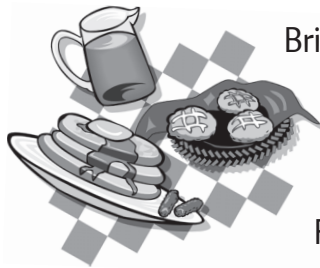
FRIDAY LUNCH SPECIAL

Board of Directors' Update

2007 saw a lot of progress made at Arlington with improvements to the Arlington House. We have gone through several hard rains and there have been NO leaks in our new roof and improved guttering system. Outside, the House is being renovated with wood rot repair, new windows, new painting, and a new parking area. Painting will also occur inside of the House. The pool project is on target with constant work being completed every week. The new guttering work is being done, with a new filtration system and accompanying pipes being replaced to eliminate our loss of water from the pool. You can see the work being done on the pool deck if you drive through the area. All of the work on the House and Pool are to be completed in early 2008.

Work is constantly being done on the golf course with changes being made to improve play out on the course. The Arlington Planning Committee is projecting that we will have the plans for the Pro Shop from 52/53 Design Group, with bids going out in early 2008 and hopefully work to begin in early March, 2008 on our new facility. We will continue to work with this project and keep it on time and within our budget. We are already planning to make some adjustments due to the expanded location of the facility. You will be able to see changes as they occur. Yes, we have plans to use gas golf carts this summer, while the facility is being built, but we will go back to our electric carts as soon as the facility is completed. Additionally, you will see improvements in the tennis courts for our members who play tennis.

2008 should be the year that all our Arlington Renovations/Deferred Maintenance Projects are completed; then we all can continue to enjoy our great new and enhanced facilities. The Arlington Board continues to ask for your continued support and responses to all the many activities that are going on at OUR Arlington. As with any club, with several members, there are always questions and rumors with regards to all that is going on. Adults and guests 13 and over will select from our regular menu, with the opportunity to "create their own sundae" for \$2.95 each.

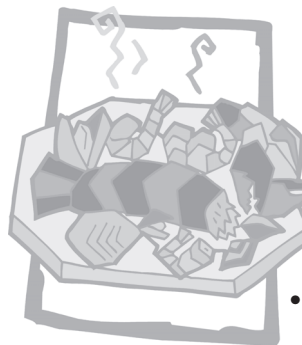

From the Superintendent's Desk

It is late November as I write this message. Fall is shifting to winter and the leaves are finally beginning to fall in earnest. The leaves really hung in there this year. I guess the trees really needed to continue to store energy for the spring. Next spring will really tell us how much the drought of 07" had on our trees. We have removed about 15 dead trees this fall already. We are in the process of beginning our replanting program for the upcoming years. We purchased about 90 trees this fall with the anticipation of trees in decline.

We have finished the bunker on hole #3 and finished sodding around the bunkers on hole #'s 13, 14. This completes our bunker renovation project. I don't have the final numbers in front of me yet, but I believe we finished this project under budget and slightly over on time. It has been a learning process from the beginning. I believe we made improvements on each bunker throughout the rebuilding process. While they are not perfect, I believe we have a much better product now than when we started. I want to commend my whole crew on their outstanding work.

I look forward to working with the golf committee to continue to improve our golf course. There are still some areas of attention that need to be addressed. Continue to strengthen the weak areas of our roughs. Work on removing the common Bermuda from our Zoysia fairways. The addition of new tee boxes and leveling of others and being prepared for any changes due to the renovation to the property.
