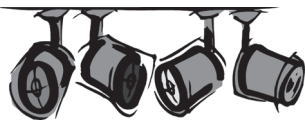

Board of Directors Update

It has been my continued effort to keep all of you informed via the Arlington Association Newsletter as to action taken by the Board and address concerns you may have. We have been working diligently on keeping projects on task and making adjustments based on the funds available. It has also been our intention to get the most from the funds we have and address as many of the concerns that you as members have.

First, let me explain that we did not lose as many members as we projected. As of the end of March we have 1066 members at Arlington, 582 golf memberships and 199 dining only memberships. While we were below our projected loss, we did not anticipate the large number of members who changed to dining only. While this is good in terms of retaining members and meeting the needs of members, we did lose their full membership payment and full assessment. We were happy that members chose to keep their membership at Arlington and took a membership category that meets their needs.

Secondly, according to our best financial estimates, Arlington has \$3,700,000 to spend on all projects. Based on these projections, the Arlington Board approved a recommendation from the Arlington Planning Committee that the following projects be completed at the amounts indicated:

Pool Renovation—	\$900,000
Golf Club House —	\$1,700,000
House Renovation—	\$475,000
Restrooms Golf Course—	\$100,000
Parking/Tennis Court Renovation—	\$350,000

This total expenditure equals \$3,525,000 and leaves a contingency of \$175,000 to address any projects that may run a little higher than anticipated. This does not leave much leeway. With the projected categories above and funds available we will be able to completely re-do the existing pool and provide new mechanical equipment to solve our pool problems. The pool size will remain the same, but we will have new decking, guttering, pool liner, and filtration system and mechanical additions. We will also have new pool accessories and fencing. Arlington House will have a new roof and outside finishing that keeps its original historical look. Parking will be added to the side and back of Arlington House with a connecting road to the existing entrance that goes to the Mule Barn. Lower Tennis Courts will be re-surfaced and painted. The Golf Pro Shop will be built and will be two stories with golf cart storage underneath and Pro Shop on top, but at existing street level. The Pro Shop/Club House will include new dressing rooms for men and women along with a small dining area.

I think that these projects are within the amounts budgeted and adjusted due to the amount of funds available and addresses the needs of Arlington as well as addressing the variety of concerns from all our different Arlington members who use one or all of the areas being renovated or deferred maintenance completed.

Finally, the Board also made adjustments in the Arlington Pool Regulations that you received earlier to make it easier for our members to invite friends from Madison and surrounding counties for a limit of 5 times. We also made it easier for members who have children who visit them during the summer months to be provided a more open environment to swim at Arlington. You can check with Coach Cahill and/or Mr. Marsh if you have questions about swimming regulations.

I hope this addresses the concerns that many of you have expressed over the past several years and meets the needs of all Arlington members. Thank you for retaining your membership and it is our hope that we can increase members because we have approximately 20,000 alumni in Madison and Fayette counties who can now become Arlington members. Thank you for your support.

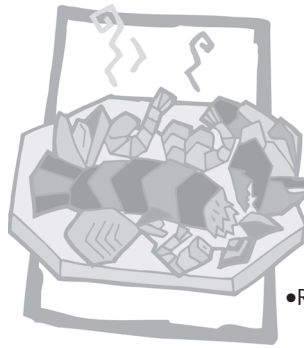
Club Within The Club

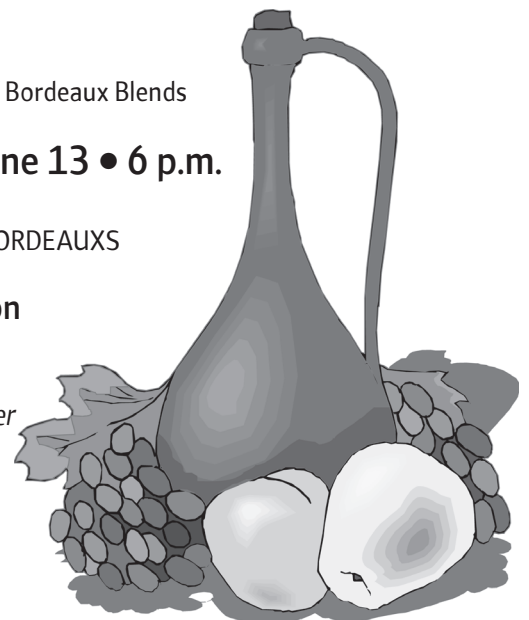
